

Notes from the Council.....

Many thanks to all the volunteers that helped to produce such a lovely poppy display. I was told that the Blisworth Scouts were really onboard to help put up the display. Since the following Round and About won't be until February, I'd take the opportunity to thank all the volunteers that organise the Christmas activities each year and there is a lot of work is being done by groups in Blisworth at the moment to bring Christmas Joy to the village! I am sure that you will find more details about the various events in the rest of this Round and About. Thank you also to the residents that take the time to attend these events.

Thank you also to the volunteers that have helped to organise works at the Closed Cemetery. There is still a lot of work to do, but I hope you agree, they are doing a great job and in the spring, they can start planting more butterfly and bee friendly plants to increase the bio-diversity of the area.

Blisworth Parish Council (BPC) continues with on-going discussions with Dame Andrea Leadsom, major representatives of West Northants Council and Kier (Highways) as well as the Police concerning the increasingly horrendous situation regarding the volume, weight and speed of the traffic in the village as well as discussing the condition of the footpaths and dropped kerbs. We are also continuing to watch and respond to the proposed development on the Northampton Road (currently the land is being leased to Network Rail to carry out works on the embankment).

We now have 12 volunteers that have stepped up to do the Community Speed Watch training, unfortunately they cannot start the training sessions until March 2024 but at least we can say to the task force making decisions about the traffic speeds etc, that we have that ready in place to go.

West Northants Council have stated that they will resurface Knock Lane to deal with the appalling pot holes but we also need to get them to change the signage at the new Roade By -Pass roundabout clearly signally that Blisworth is not suitable for HGV traffic to safeguard the subsiding section of Stoke Road in Blisworth.

Please continue to contact the Police with information about vehicles exceeding the 3T weight limit and also any issues with aggressive behaviour or damage to cars, property or pavements in the village. It is important to contact the Police, otherwise information sent via BPC may be perceived as simply anecdotal or at worse biased. It is important that the Police receive directly from residents so that they can build a clear picture of the traffic situation in the village and that means logging all incidents (though I am aware, that it isn't easy, but don't give up – make sure they log all incidents).
