Our local PCSO Matt Taylor will be at the Police Beat Bus on Wed, 27 March 2024, at the Royal Oak Car Park, between 3pm to 4pm. Seize this opportunity to discuss any local concerns with Matt. Future visits are set for 19 June, 11 Sept and 4 Dec (3 - 4 pm at the Royal Oak Car Park). Special thanks to the Royal Oak for generously allowing us to use their premises. Note that visits are subject to change based on operational requirements.

The Police offered a cyber awareness course in November which was kindly hosted, free of charge, by the Blisworth Baptist Church and though it was very informative, it was not well attended. If any other groups in the village would be interested in hosting this free course for your members, please contact the Clerk.

The Parish Council met to decide on the next financial year's budget. Last year (2023-2024), we didn't increase the Parish Council part of the Council Tax, but for next year (2024-2025) a 5% increase has been decided. The Parish Council part of your Council Tax is small (about 3%); nevertheless, we are acutely aware of the financial pressures on households. The Parish Council has worked hard to get better value for money but next year we cannot avoid a modest increase. We expect that this will allow the Parish Council to put some money aside to contribute towards the cost of traffic calming measures and pavement improvements in the coming years.



The Parish Council continues to advocate for action to reduce traffic through the village. Meetings with key stakeholders are scheduled in January and February, focusing on traffic, footpaths, and dropped kerbs. Efforts behind the scenes successfully convinced Network Rail not to use the village roads to access their current site on Northampton Road.

The Parish Council's work at the Closed Cemetery and the allotments is continuing according to plans and should be completed by late spring. Having cleared the overgrown vegetation in parts of Chapel Lane, we have scheduled for it to be treated with weedkiller (it may need repeat treatments) at which point the Parish Council have plans to re-seed the area with wildflowers. Thank you to the very kind resident who made some bird boxes for the Closed Cemetery. We may also be given some free trees. If you have suggestions for a good place to plant a small tree in the village, please share your thoughts with the Council.

If you come across any fly-tipping on the canal tow-path, please take a photo with a location reference and send it to the Clerk. We'll follow up with the Canal and River Trust to have it removed.

Regarding rubbish, the bin by the Tunnel Car Park was not being emptied before Christmas, prompting the Parish Council to request WNC to empty it. Unfortunately, they left a great deal of rubbish that had not been placed in the bin. An extremely thoughtful resident offered to clear up the remaining mess, even though a Councillor had already offered to clear the rubbish. We are fortunate to have such kind-hearted residents in the village.

We have finally, after much persistence, got a date from Highways to clear the vegetation that currently obscures the metal barrier on Stoke Road. Part of Stoke Road between Greenside and Knock Lane will be closed: (0930-1430) between 25-29th March 2024. The Parish Council have asked Kier to confirm if this a full closure or if there will be traffic lights, but they have not confirmed as yet.
